

The Neon Vortex by Jen Stark

Location: Ziff Ballet Opera House

One of the most popular selfie spots is tucked under the staircase between tiers one and two. The Neon Vortex, designed by Jen Stark, adds splashes of groovy colors to the Ziff Ballet Opera's sleek aesthetic.

2. BRAVA By Brad Kilgore

Location: Second Floor of Ziff Ballet Opera House

BRAVA By Brad Kilgore offers patrons an Italian-based, a-la-carte menu crafted by James Beard award finalist Chef Brad Kilgore, and posh dining aesthetics. The orchid wall inside the restaurant is almost as eye-catching as the chef's creative cuisine.

3. Illuminated Columns

Location: Ziff Ballet Opera House and John S. and James L. Knight Concert Hall Lobbies No visit to the Arsht Center can be complete without snapping a pic of our twinkling columns in the lobbies of the Ziff Ballet Opera House and the John S. and James L. Knight Concert Hall.

4. View from the Porthole

Location: Ziff Ballet Opera House and John S. and James L. Knight Concert Hall As you wait for the elevator in the tiers, take a look through one of the portholes for a different perspective of the lobbies.

5. Hibiscus Proscenium Curtain

Location: Ziff Ballet Opera House

Created by Robert Rahway Zakanitch, the Hibiscus Proscenium Curtain adds tropical, Floridian flare to the Ziff Ballet Opera House's modernistic interior aesthetic.

Location: Ziff Ballet Opera House

7. John S. and James L. Knight Concert Hall

Location: Inside the concert hall

The acoustically superb Knight Concert Hall's wooden interior design is not only aesthetically warm and inviting, but also one of the most photographed concert halls in the city!

8. "Ways of Performing" Tile Mural by Cundo Bermudez

Location: Carnival Studio Theater - Ziff Ballet Opera House

Cundo Bermudez' "Ways of Performing" tile mural is one of the Center's most recognizable public art installations. This mural proves that there's no such thing as a "bad angle!"

Location: Parker and Vann Thomson Plaza for the Arts (Corner of NE 13th Street and 2nd Ave)
